#### **Purchase of Super B Trailer**

Council accepted the bid received from Summit Trailer Ltd. for the purchase of one (1) 2024 Arne's Super B Crossgate Trailer in the amount of \$159,075 plus GST.

#### **Alberta Advantage Immigration Program**

Council approved to direct administration to submit the Community Enrolment Form to participate in the Rural Entrepreneur Stream of the Alberta Advantage Immigration Program.

#### **Ecostrat Inc.** — Clean Fuels Fund

Council approved to direct administration to partner with Ecostrat Inc. to submit a grant application for the Clean Fuels Fund – Establishing Biomass Supply Chains funding opportunity prior to the November 23, 2022 deadline.

#### **2022 Cancellation of Taxes and Arrears of Community Held Properties**

Council approved that taxes and arrears in the amount of \$6,645.11 be cancelled for the following previously held CP Rail parcels: 198610, 199010, 199020, 199030, 202810, 203010, 210310, 210320, 306510, 306610.

#### **Appointment of Assessor**

#### **Request for Cancellation of Tax Penalty**

Council respectfully denied the request for the cancellation of the penalty levied on Rolls 249200, 249300, 247000, 247100, 247400, 259900, 260000, 260100, 261400 in the amount of \$705.53.

#### 2023 Flagstaff Regional Emergency Services Society (FRESS) Budget

Council approved that prior to approving the proposed 2023 Flagstaff Regional Emergency Services Society (FRESS) budget, that in accordance with the FRESS master agreement, we request a 3-year operating budget and a 5-year capital budget that is prepared in accordance with the budget process in Schedule "F" Finance and Funding of FRESS.

Council approved to recommend that a review of the FRESS master agreement and the attached Transitional Solutions Inc. Business & Implementation Plan be completed by the Flagstaff Chief Administrative Officers, to inform the board of the progress, successes and actions required from the first year of operations.

#### Appointments under the Weed Control, Agricultural Pests and Soil Conservation Acts — 2022

Council appointed Jessica Armitage as a Weed and Pest Inspector for Flagstaff County under Section 9 (1) of the Agricultural Pests Act and Section 7 (1) of the Weed Control Act and a Soil Conservation Officer for Flagstaff County under Section 15(1) of the Soil Conservation Act.

#### **Private Laneway Maintenance**


