## Council Highlights



### Regular Council Meeting of June 28, 2023

**Council Highlights** briefly identify decisions made by Council. Council encourages its residents, businesses and stakeholders to keep in touch with Council news.

#### **Shock Trauma Air Rescue Society (STARS)**

Council approved to increase our Shock Trauma Air Rescue Society (STARS) funding to \$15,000 for 2024, 2025, and 2026. Our funding had previously been at \$8,000 annually. Since 2008, Flagstaff County has provided STARS with more than \$200,000 in funding.

#### **2024 Flagstaff County Programs and Services Priorities**

Council approved the 2024 Programs and Services Priorities as presented for the 2024-2026 Business Plan and Budget.

#### **Zone 5 ARMAA Conference**

Council approved a request to provide \$1,000 to the Alberta Rural Municipal Administrators' Association (ARMAA) to assist with hosting the Zone 5 ARMAA conference to be held August 29-31, 2023 in Cold Lake.

#### **Agricultural Service Board Recommendations**

Council accepted the nomination of Dane and Heather Miller for the 2023 Farmfair International Farm Family Award.

Council approved to request additional information on program costs and guidelines on the delivery of a program to establish wood chip storage sites by the Sedgewick shop yard, Galahad school grounds, and Strome Fire Hall.

Council approved a recommendation from the ASB to enhance the Leafy Spurge Program in 2023 at a net budget of \$50,000, to be funded by Reserves - Agriculture.
