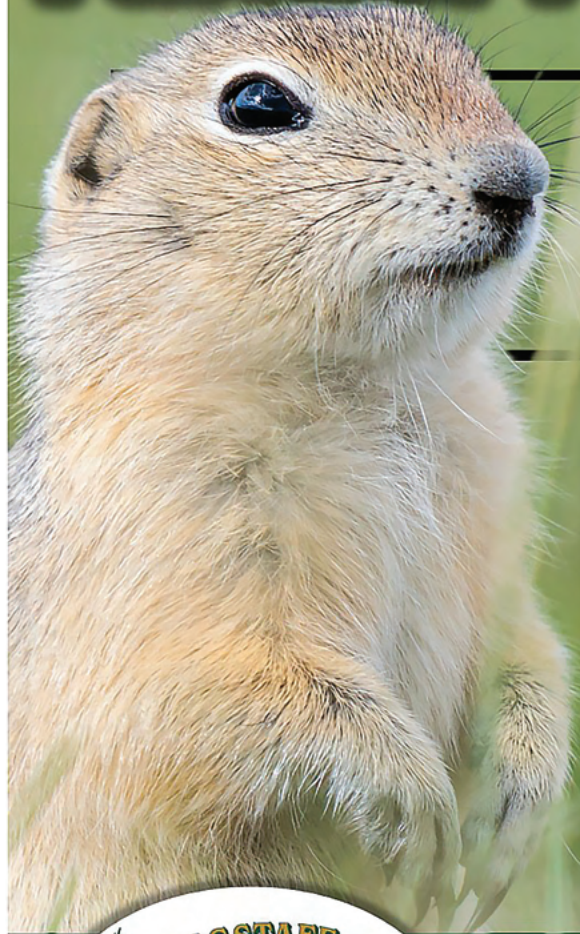

at the County Office**

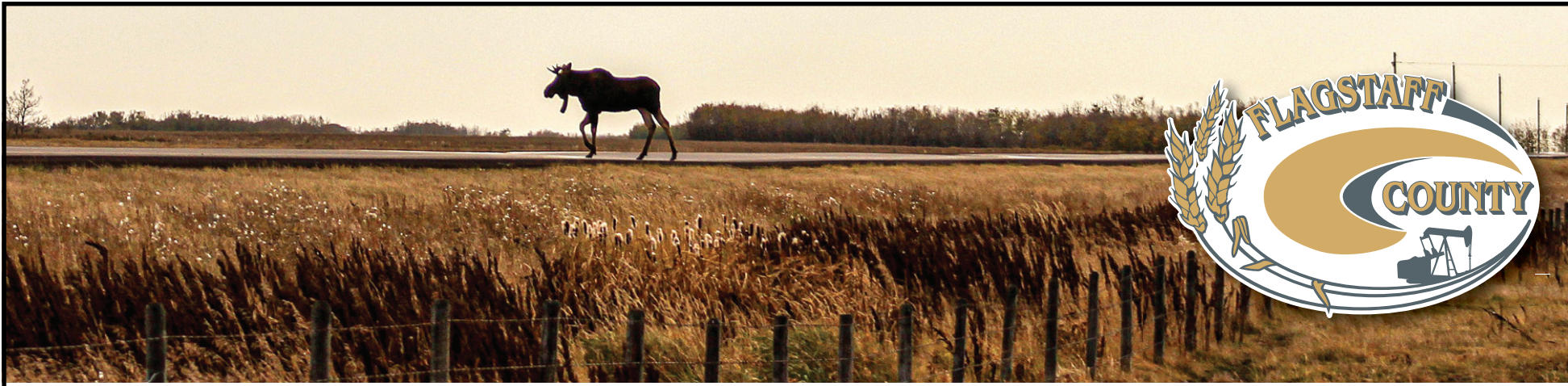


Controlling rodents such as Richardson's ground squirrels continues to be a challenge for producers in Flagstaff County, especially now that 2% liquid strychnine is no longer registered for use across Canada. One alternative is fumigant Phostoxin. However, producers must have their Farmer Pesticide Certificate and Exterior Rodent Control Endorsement before purchasing or using Phostoxin. To give producers an opportunity to earn that certificate and endorsement, we are looking at possibly offering another one-day course with a licensed pesticide applicator and safety trainer in the spring of 2024.
